UK Seafarer Certificates

Due to the ongoing global disruption to maritime transport and associated supporting administerial offices as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, through the Maritime and Coastguard Agency (MCA), has introduced the following measures to enable holders of UK Seafarer Certification to continue to work and support international trade:

- The issuance of temporary certification for a duration of up to 12 months for Certificates of Competency and Certificates of Equivalent Competency.
- The extension of validity to Certificates of Proficiency for Emergency, Occupation Safety and Survival Functions as defined in Chapter VI of the STCW Convention for a duration of up to 6 months.
- The extension of validity to Certificates of Proficiency for Tankers, Passenger Ships, ships subject to the IGF code and ships subject to the Polar Code as defined in Chapter V of the STCW Convention and the STCW Code for a duration of up to 12 months.
- The extension of validity to STCW GMDSS Endorsement as defined in Chapter IV/2 of the STCW Code for a duration of up to 12 months.
- Further extensions may be granted if the current disruption persists.
