SHORE LEAVE FOR CREW WORKING ONBOARD VESSELS VISITING THE PORT OF SINGAPORE

- 1. With effect from 1 April 2022, fully vaccinated ships' crew visiting the Port of Singapore will be granted shore leave.
- 2. Fully vaccinated¹ ships' crew who wish to go ashore while in the port shall present the following documents to the Immigration and Checkpoints Authority (ICA) officer at the check points²:
 - a. Certificate of negative Antigen Rapid Test (ART) supervised by <u>approved licensed</u> <u>providers in Singapore</u> taken within two days³ before disembarking the vessel;
 - b. Valid overseas/Singapore vaccination certificate:
 - c. Valid passport;
 - d. SGAC/e-HDC4; and
 - e. Valid visa (if applicable)

¹ An individual is considered fully vaccinated two weeks after he or she has received two doses of Pfizer-BioNTech/ Comirnaty, Moderna, or any vaccines in the World Health Organisation's Emergency Use Listing such as Sinovac-CoronaVac, Sinopharm, and AstraZeneca.

² Gazetted landing places such as Marina South Pier, West Coast Pier, Jurong Fishery Port, Tuas Mega Port or designated Port gates. The 4 designated Ports Gates for crew clearance are Keppel entrance Crew Clearance Office (at Keppel Free Trade Zone), Pasir Panjang Crew Clearance Office (at Pasir Panjang Free Trade Zone), Sembawang Gate (at Sembawang Free Trade Zone) and Jurong Port Main Gate Crew Clearance Office (at Jurong Free Trade Zone).

³ For example, if the ART is taken on 1 November 2021, it will be valid up to 3 November 2021, 2359 hours

⁴ To be submitted online at least three days before disembarking the vessel
